The meeting was called to order by Vice President Dori Holt. October day minutes were approved on a motion by Donna Jones, seconded by Aline Wadsworth. November birthdays were acknowledged. The Nominating Committee presented the slate of officers for 2011; written ballots were passed out with the results to be announced after the break. The Christmas party was discussed. It will be held at Provino's at 6:00 p.m. on December 2. A gift exchange will be held with a \$10 - \$15 item for those who wish to participate.

Rachel presented "Just for the Fun of It" by showing 3 inner circles of her Thanksgiving circular wall hanging. Phyl Schiwal, Gail Ford, and Bev Mahle won the items.

Ways and Means: A drawing will be held after the break for the fabric calculator and the ruler bag.

Bee: The last meeting of the year was held at Sandra Wilson's home. A wonderful time was had.

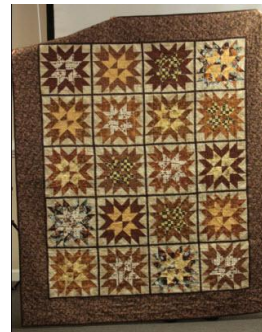

Treasurer's Report: Due to new invoices not yet accounted for, the estimated balance is \$2,500.

Ways and Means: Tonight a lamp will be raffled.

Membership: The Guild welcomed one guest, Debra Mitchell. Fat quarters were won by Gail Ford; door prizes went to Albertha Brown and Patti Howell.

Community Service: We are still working on ideas for the new year. Contact Beverly Mahle with suggestions.

"Just for the Fun of It": Rachel gave out embroidered panels this month; they were won by Tina Corbitt, Joyce Trew, and Jennie Hollis.

Hospitality: Please sign the sheet going around for snack or drink.

Georgia Donation Quilt: On January 31, the quilt will be brought to the capitol to hang for one day. Denise Allee and Sandra Wilson will accompany the quilt. Broach Winsley will supply a stand for the quilt. Anyone is welcome to view the quilt during the day.

Sunshine: Remember to send emails or call Vickie Hecht to let her know if someone needs our attention.

Library: Bring back any items that belong to the library. The library has been streamlined, so check the back table for free items and additions. Please make use of the great, FREE resource.

Newsletter: Turn in all articles as soon as possible before Thanksgiving.

Programs: At the January day meeting, Albertha Brown will teach construction of her quilt carrier with wooden handles. Plan to stay until about 3 to sew as much as you can on this project. Bring a lunch or plan to go to a nearby restaurant. The January night meeting will feature Tammy and Julia from "Outside the Lines Design."

Photography/ Historian: New photos are on the table. Check out our history book.

Quilt 'til You Wilt: A total of 23 members attended and ate so well that the day was a great success.

Bees: Irene thanked everyone for the great participation this year and the homes that were open for everyone. Sandra Wilson will be in charge next year, so check the new schedule for 2011.

New Business: We have two cabinets that we need to eliminate. They are metal and one locks. Someone has offered \$20 per cabinet. 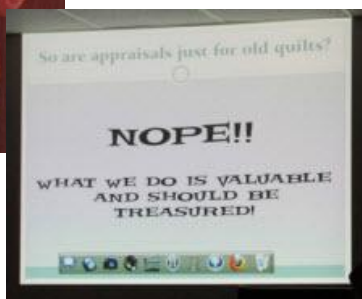
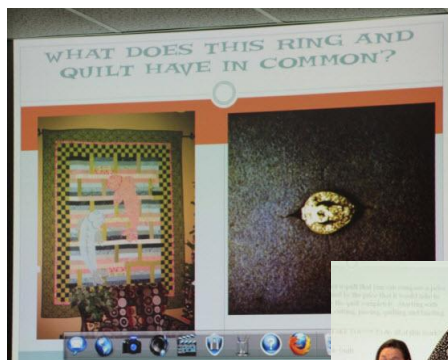

PROGRAM SUPPLIES

Constructing the Quilt Carrier

January 13, 2011

Albertha Brown

1 ½ yards quilted reversible fabric

1 pkg double-folded ½-inch bias tape to match your fabric

1 heavyweight cardboard for bag bottom. I suggest the kind that a bolt of fabric is wrapped around (free at Joann Fabrics)

5/8 yards of fabric to cover the board—cut 2 rectangles 10 x 25. Choose fabric to coordinate with your bag; fabric does not need to be quilted. **Please pre-cut your cardboard to 24" long.**

2 ½-inch dowels, each cut to 22 inches long. You may paint them if you wish.

The cutting of the bag parts is very simple and quick; we can do this in class. You will also need to bring the necessary supplies to class:

Sewing machine

Rotary cutter/scissors

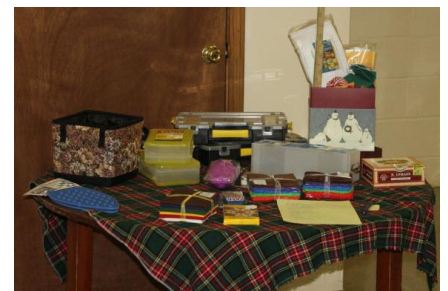
Cutting board (large)

Matching thread

Large ruler (6" x 23")

NOTE: I will try to bring some extra cardboards to class.

FEATURED MEMBER PATTI HOWELL

How long have you been quilting? About 25 years.

Who taught you how to quilt? Nobody. My mother taught me to Embroider and make doll clothes when I was 6 years old. I continued to sew from then on making my clothes, home decorations, crafts, and grandchildren heirloom dresses. So I just assumed I knew how to sew and could start quilting whenever I wanted. Both my grandmothers quilted and I wanted to, but I didn't have time until my children were grown. I then just started quilting. It didn't take me long to realize that I did need instruction and then I began taking classes from some very knowledgeable national teachers. I highly recommend learning how to quilt before starting.

What are your favorite quilting techniques? I don't think I have a favorite. I like it all. I especially like to finish a quilt so I can start another. I like piecing, paper-piecing, appliqué and hand quilting.

What are your favorite colors to work with? I seem to gravitate toward the bold, bright colors. I love the soft colors but never seem to have any of these. I guess pastels are my least favorite.

What are your favorite fabrics to work with? I use cotton most of the time. I have never used anything else but would like to try silk and wool.

What is your favorite quilt shop? My favorite is Intown Quilters, but I really like them all. I like Intown because they carry so much of the fabrics I really like and many different lines. I always seem to find something to buy at each shop.

If you sew by machine, what kind(s) do you use? I have two Berninas; one is very old and the other is newer. I have a featherweight which I leave at the lake house and then I always have something to sew when I go over there. I also have an HQ-16 quilting machine and I enjoy doing all my quilting on it.

What inspires you to make a particular quilt? I think I'm backward. I usually find a fabric I like (can't live without) and then look for a pattern to make. I am more of a textile person. I have favorite fabric designers such as Jane Sassaman (she lights up my world), Kaffe Fassett and Company. There are many others, but I can't think of them.

What is your favorite quilting book or pattern? Again, I think I like them all. I have quite a few books and want to make something from all of them. I also see things in magazines and want to make them. I especially like the Fig Tree books and fabrics, but I haven't made but one of their quilts.

On average, how many quilts do you make in a year? Probably 10 to 12 large quilts and a few wall hangings.

Do you quilt your own quilts or do you send them out? I quilt all my quilts.

What quilt-related item(s) are you working on right now? I have three large quilt tops ready to quilt right now and two wall hangings. I hope to finish these before January as I want to start something new.

What other hobbies do you have? I am a pianist and organist. I also love to paint. I refinish furniture and do faux painting. But I haven't done very much of this for the past ten years. I have spent all my time quilting and still have a lot of UFOs.

Tell about one way that quilting has changed your life. The one thing quilting has done for me is kept me busy. Being busy keeps me healthy and happy. I have also made some really good friends at the quilt guild. Also, it keeps me out of my husband's way. He used to complain because I made messes in his shop when I worked on furniture.

Are you on any committees with the CRQG? Yes, Challenge quilt.

Feel free to tell us more about yourself and your family. I have two wonderful children and five grandchildren. Of course, they are the best ever. Grandchildren are my greatest joy.
